COURSE TOPICS

Oral Medicine for GPs: This course gives dentists the tools to diagnose abnormal and pathological conditions within the mouth. Using clinical pictures and x-ray imaging and by teaching diagnostic process and differential diagnosis (DiffDx), the course addresses systemic health conditions manifesting as oral changes and also possible treatment of oral conditions, including: What a lesion looks like, the general concepts of diagnostics and value of patient histories Appropriate communication with other doctors Review common lesions including, candidiasis, frictional hyperkeratosis, lichen planus, auto-immune diseases manifested in the mouth, apthous ulcers, hemangiomas, hematomas and ecchymosis, HSV 1, HPV and other viral lesions, oral cancers and radiographic lesions.

Intro to Dental Sleep Medicine (8 CE Units): This course is intended to provide a comprehensive overview of diagnosis and treatment of sleep apnea cases for dentists interested in adding this growth area to their practices. Dr. Veis will cover all aspects diagnosis and the sleep study, deciding which appliances to use for treatment, measuring and fitting the appliances, interacting with the fabricating lab, and how to manage the billings to medical insurance, including: Provide an understanding of the scope of the problem and why we need to be at the front lines in its recognition and treatment.
