COURSE TOPICS

Beating Up Perio Disease: *This webinar is NOT the basic dental school approach to Periodontal Disease. Also, by better understanding diagnosing, treating, and maintaining Periodontal Disease, clinicians can set a more predictable foundation for their restorative results as well. Objectives include:* Periodontal disease diagnostic factors ♦ Rationale both for and AGAINST plaque control ♦ Long term maintenance care – a foundational concept ♦ Occlusion and it's role ♦ Teeth vs. Implants – which is best? ♦ Furcations – to treat or not to treat? Can they really be maintained? (Spoiler: YES!) ♦ What is the role of Diamine Fluoride in adult maintenance care? ♦ Minimally invasive antimicrobial methods for treatment ♦ Simplified - yet effective - self-care for patients at home

Dental Pharmacology: *Dentists oversee the treatment and management of acute and chronic pain and relieving anxiety in connection with dental treatment. Increased awareness of the addiction potential of opioids has resulted in many new laws and guidelines for the prescribing of these medications. Although dentists are not usually involved in the prescribing or dispensing of cannabis products, as health care professionals we should have a working knowledge of these substances. Information presented will include:* The latest biomedical ramifications of addiction/substance, including the disease model of addiction, biopsychosocial predispositions, and genetic susceptibilities ♦ The concepts of tachyphylaxis (drug tolerance), psychological dependence, physical dependence and the drugs used in the short-term treatment of substance abuse detox-withdrawal syndromes ♦ Opioid use and misuse ♦ New guidelines and laws regarding the prescribing of opioids as well as the DEA scheduling of drugs ♦ The nature of cannabinoids, natural and synthetic ♦ CBD and the OTC CBD oil craze ♦ An understanding of CBD labeled products ♦ The dangers of super-high potency marijuana preparations ♦ Cannabinoid drugs and common side effects as well as adverse effects

Oral Surgery for GPs: *This presentation will cover the "basics" of oral surgery for the general practitioner. The typical dentist's training in oral surgery is usually quite rudimentary, but in private practice, referral to a specialist may not be an option in every case. Yet, should a problem arise, general practitioners are held to the same standard of care as the specialist. This course aims to increase the knowledge level and comfort zone of the general dentist when performing surgical procedures. Topics to be covered include:* Evaluation of the patient's medical history, management of the patient on anticoagulants, antibiotic prophylaxis, and informed consent ♦ Presurgical planning, local anesthesia, design and use of surgical flaps, handpieces and hand instruments ♦ Classification of third molar impactions, surgical techniques for impacted teeth, and management of the surgical site ♦ Biopsy indications and techniques, and management of complications ♦ Many surgical techniques will be illustrated using video of the procedures discussed.

Reimagined Endo: *Minimally invasive, restorative driven, endodontic treatment, has revolutionized the way we save teeth, with long-term successful outcomes. This unique course will help you wade through the latest materials and techniques and highlight what advanced endodontic treatment looks like today.
