**July 28:** Introduction to Dental Sleep Medicine *Dr. Erin Elliott* is the past president and a diplomate of the American Sleep and Breathing Academy and has lectured extensively on Dental Sleep Medicine to help general dentists extend this life-saving service to their patients.

Treating Complex Patients- Managing their Pain, Complications and Care: Opioids Segment - This course was designed to cover all the required CE Opioid topics for dentists to renew their state licenses. Objectives include: Identify the types of opioid abuse seen in patients ◆ Know opioid alternatives & be able to prescribe the procedure-appropriate doses ◆ Recognize the signs & symptoms of opioid overdose & how to administer an opioid antagonist drug ◆ Practice safe & effective management of dental pain Bisphosphonate-Related Osteonecrosis of the Jaws (BRONJ) is a complication of drugs used to treat osteoporosis & bone disease in a variety of cancers. Millions have been exposed to these drugs & incomplete & misinformation complicates these patients' dental care. This course segment attempts to make some sense of it all, including: Understand which patients are susceptible to developing BRONJ & its presumed pathophysiology ◆ Assess patient risk of developing BRONJ from a dental procedure & strategies to minimize it Proper treatment planning & surgical techniques can avoid some implant complications, but others are unavoidable, even in the most capable hands. Early recognition & management is key to a successful outcome. This segment reviews common issues encountered, including: Evaluate your implant planning using 3D CBCT software to ensure adequate spacing, bony support and long-term success ◆ Common complications of implant surgery & how to manage & avoid them ◆ Factors both reducing the risk of implant success & increasing the risk of implant failure.

Pediatric Dentistry for the Modern GP Practice: Dr. Johnson will cover a number of procedures & techniques in his case-based program. He also teaches how to use social media to leverage your services into a better practice. Topics include: Properly diagnose the pulpal & periapical status of primary teeth with deep caries lesions \times When & how to use the Hall technique-where dental decay is sealed within a tooth using a either a pre-fab crown or a restorative material \times Indications and usages of stainless steel crowns \times The Who, What, Where, When, Why's of SDF and GI treatments on both primary and permanent teeth \times Understand and define the three aspects of an inbound marketing campaign and implementing marketing strategies to engage with current and potential patients.

Phenomenal Restorations - Managing Edentulous Sites in the Esthetic Zone: This course will present options for the successful restoration of anterior edentulous sites, discussing step-by-step methods to fabricate resin bonded temporary splints and implant provisionals. Content includes: Treatment plan & manage an existing or future edentulous site ◆ Options to provisionalize an anterior edentulous site ◆ Manage soft tissue to yield the most esthetic result ◆ How the anatomy of underlying osseous landmarks determines the final outcome Restoring Endodontically Treated Teeth - This segment offers a systematic approach to restore endodontically treated teeth, including minimally invasive concepts, preserving the bio-rim & determining when to use a post. Objectives include: Evaluating what is remaining before & after endo ◆ Prevent coronal micro-leakage ◆ Options for post and cores ◆ Assessing marginal ridge fractures

OSHA, Infection Control & the CA Dental Practice Act: This course will not only entertain you and your staff but will enable attendees to meet license renewal requirements and state and federal requirements for OSHA Bloodborne Pathogen training, and Infection Control.
