Modern Ceramic Restorations (Lecture): With the explosion in ceramic material choices in today's indirect restorative arena, practitioners often find themselves puzzled about what type of crown to prescribe for a given indication. Special emphasis will be placed on strategies and techniques that lead to optimal outcomes with regards to quality, while increasing speed and productivity. Real strategies will be provided to the audience to maximize the efficiencies in their crown and bridge practice while delivering long lasting and beautiful restorations that increase patient satisfaction! The course aims to demystify the selection criteria. 
